WHAT'S TRENDING: UTILITY SPENDING

The U.S. power transmission lines and towers market is forecasted to grow at 4% CAGR from 2022 to 2027 - behind the global market's 5.54% CAGR forecast. More U.S. investment is needed to keep pace with global standards for safety and reliability, connect renewable energy sources to the grid, and meet the public's evolving power needs.
