

Canada Training Courses

Traffic Control Person

The Traffic Control Program will provide participants with the knowledge and skills for the certification as a Traffic Control Person. Upon successful completion, attendees receive certification for 3 years and are immediately able to start working as a Traffic Controller.

Province of coverage: Nova Scotia, Prince Edward Island and New Brunswick

Training includes:

- Legislative roles and responsibilities of workplace parties
- Traffic control legislation
- · Roles and responsibilities of a TCP
- · Traffic control devices and hierarchy of controls
- · Setting up, maintaining and removing work sites
- · Emergency preparedness and response activities
- · Accident & Incident reporting

Temporary Workplace Signer

The Temporary Workplace Signer course provides accreditation through training developed and administered by Provincial Public Works. Course includes instruction on the contents of the Traffic Control Manual and how to apply the information in the manual for worker and road safety. Certification is valid for 3 years.

Province of coverage: Nova Scotia and Prince Edward Island

- Use of the lates Provincial Traffic Control Manual
- Legal authority and liability
- · Fundamental principles
- Components of a Temporary Workplace
- · Work duration / roadway encroachment
- Temporary condition signs and devices
- · Sign, device and Traffic Control Person placement
- · Planning and preparation checklist (PPCL)
- · Application guides

Work Area Traffic Control Manager (WATCM NB)

The WATCM training course is approved by the Traffic Branch of the New Brunswick Department of Transportation.

3 YEAR CERTIFICATION

Province of coverage: New Brunswick

Training includes:

- Use of the latest New Brunswick Traffic Control Manual
- Definitions at a Temporary Workplace
- · General information and fundamental principles
- · Work area personnel
- Traffic control devices
- · Installation and inspection of traffic control devices
- Traffic control set up and tear down procedures

Traffic Control Person (Newfoundland) Level #1 and Level #2

3 YEAR CERTIFICATION

Training is designed to give participants the knowledge and skills required to fulfill duties as a Traffic Control Person.

Province of coverage: Newfoundland

TCP Level #1 is mandatory for any person responsible for directing traffic movement and preventing conflicts between vehicles and road activities such as road maintenance, construction, road incidents and emergency operations.

TCP Level #2 is a voluntary course that is designed for persons who develop traffic control plans.

Fall Protection

Upon completion of the course, participants will have a comprehensive understanding of fall protection as it pertains to elevated working conditions. Participants will be able to identify which fall protection option is best suited to their individual needs and the nature of their activities.

Electrical Awareness

Course id for anyone that may work in the vicinity of overhead powerlines or working on or near an elevated structure that is used to support electrical equipment. Course is available in both Provincial and Federal versions.

Electrical Awareness for Arborists

CERTIFICATION The Arborcultural Electrical Safety Course (Green Card) prepares participants, such as arborists and others who work aloft, with the knowledge and skills to perform work related to Arboricultural activities in proximity to transmission and distribution lines. The course follows the requirements set by provinces and approved by local power & utility companies.

Confined Space Entry

The Confined Space Entry program will provide the participants with the knowledge to manage the risks associated with working in confined spaces and prepare them to safely enter and operate in such spaces.

Trenching and Excavation

Training will focus on the Trenching and Excavation Standards for Construction and addresses the identification and correction of hazards, soil testing methods, trench protection systems and general safety requirements.

Forklift Safety

3 YEAR Training includes the general and specific legislation pertaining to the safe operation CERTIFICATION of lift trucks, the theory behind lift truck operations and hands-on training. Program has been designed to follow both requirements of applicable local provincial regulations.

Basic First Aid

Basic First Aid is designed for people 3 YEAR who want a general knowledge of CERTIFICATION first aid principles and the emergency treatment of injuries. CPR Level C covers all aspects of CPR skills and theory for adults, children and infants. This course also covers AED (Automated External Defibrillator) training.

Certification available for Nova Scotia, New Brunswick and Prince Edward Island

Standard First Aid

Intermediate First Aid covers 3 YEAR comprehensive training in first aid and CERTIFICATION CPR. Course incorporates all Basic First Aid and is designed for those who require a more in-depth understanding of first aid applications, including, but not limited to spinal injuries, heat and cold injuries, bone and joint injuries and more.
